# 2021-2022 Opening Guidelines

## **Diocese of Orange Updated Health Guidelines**

The Diocese of Orange has released the Updated Health Guidelines for the 2021–2022 school year. As a school within the Diocese of Orange, we are required to follow the guidelines set forth by them. Below, you will find a letter from our Superintendent, Dr. Erin Barisano, explaining the guidelines that will be in place this school year. #### St. Serra Health Guidelines for the 2021-2022 School Year

#### Masks

- Students in all grade levels, TK-8, are required to wear masks indoors.
   Preschool students ages 2 and above must wear a face mask indoors.
- All adults are required to wear masks when sharing indoor spaces with students.
- Masks are optional outdoors (recess, lunch, or outdoor PE) for all students, staff and adults.
- If a student is in need of a mask, please make one available for them.
- Students are not allowed to attend class if they are not wearing a mask.



## **Physical Distancing**

 Physical distancing requirements are not necessary when other mitigation strategies are implemented (i.e. masking).

## Cleaning

- Cleaning once a day is usually sufficient enough to remove potential viruses that may be on surfaces.
- If a facility has had a sick person with COVID-19 within the last 24 hours, proper cleaning and disinfecting of the spaces occupied by that person will be conducted.

#### **Visitors**

• All visitors to campus must be masked, regardless of vaccination status.

#### Quarantining

- Staff members and students with symptoms of COVID-19 infection should not return for in-person instruction until they have met California Department of Public Health (CDPH) criteria to return to school for those with symptoms:
  - At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of feverreducing medications; and
  - Other symptoms have improved; and
  - They have a negative test for SARS-CoV-2, OR a healthcare provider has provided documentation that the symptoms are typical of their underlying chronic condition (e.g., allergies or asthma) OR a healthcare provider has confirmed an alternative named diagnosis (e.g., Streptococcal pharyngitis, Coxsackie virus), OR at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset
- <u>Quarantine recommendations for</u>: unvaccinated students for exposures when both parties were wearing a mask, as required in K-12 indoor settings. These are adapted from the CDC K-12 guidance and CDC definition of a close contact.
  - When both parties were wearing a mask in the indoor classroom setting, unvaccinated students who are close contacts (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet indoors) may undergo a modified 10-day quarantine as follows. They may continue to attend school for in-person instruction if they:
    - Are asymptomatic;
    - Continue to appropriately mask, as required;
    - Undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine; and
    - Continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting
- <u>Quarantine recommendations for</u>: unvaccinated close contacts who were not wearing masks or for whom the infected individual was not wearing a mask during the indoor exposure; or unvaccinated students as described above.
  - For these contacts, those who remain asymptomatic, meaning they have NOT had any symptoms, may discontinue self-quarantine under the following conditions:
    - Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR
  - Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected after Day 5 from the date of last exposure and tests negative



#### **Home Room Lists and Academic Placement**

- Parents will receive an email on **Friday, August 13** with a link for Homeroom Lists.
- Parents of students in Grades 2-8 will receive Academic Placement Letters in the mail beginning the week of **August 16**. Placement Letters will include student login information for CANVAS for Grades 3-8.

## Student Drop-off and Pick-up

(Preschool Students: Mrs. Reiss will give you this information at your preschool orientation)

Arrival: Student Arrival will begin at 7:10 a.m.

#### Dismissal:

- **TK Grade 2:** Dismissal will be at 2:00 p.m. on full days and 11:30 a.m. on minimum days. Pick-up will be at the drive through lanes on Avenida De Las Banderas. *The Later Gator program* will be provided for students who have siblings or carpool members in grades 3-8. This will accommodate parents so they will not have to make two trips to school for dismissal. There will be no charge for this program. Extended Care will be open for TK-2 at 2:00 p.m and 11:30 a.m. on Wednesdays. <u>Parents using the traffic pattern cannot enter the driveway on Banderas until 2:10 pm. due to our Early
  Dismissal for students in Grades TK-2.</u>
- **Grades 3 8:** Student dismissal will be at 2:40 p.m. on fulls days and 12:10 p.m. on minimum days at the Chapel Gate for walkers. Parents will not be allowed onto campus prior to 2:30 p.m. Additionally, we are asking parents not to gather in the front office reception area and remain outside.
- Parents coming early to pick-up children
  - Please keep in mind the importance of keeping your child in school and not missing seat time. When a request is made to retrieve your child from the classroom to leave school early it is time that they cannot make up. Additionally, this is disruptive to the classes. Please try and make appointments after school.
  - If there is a need to pick up your child early you will be asked to remain outside of the building until your child arrives at the front reception area.

#### **Walker Passes**

To obtain a Walker Pass students must live within a 1.5 mile radius of the school to be granted a pass. The request will be verified through FACTS. **Download Walker Form**

## **Technology**

St. Serra 1:1 Chromebook Program

All St. Serra Students in Grades Three through Eight will be issued a Lenovo 300e Chromebook for their use in the school's 1:1 program. The new Chromebooks were selected for its features, ease of management, and price. In order to become familiar with the Chromebook and software utilized by the school, the school has implemented a Boot Camp Training Program, which has been updated this year to include Chromebook and Canvas information.

All students in Grades 3–8 will complete the Chromebook section of the Boot Camp with their teachers on the first day of school. Students will learn how to use and care for their new Chromebook, as well learn about the various functions and capabilities of their device.

For students who did not attend St. Serra last year, we ask that they complete the "Canvas Student Orientation" of the Boot Camp before the first day of school. This section is intended to show students the "ins and outs" of Canvas and give them an overview of how to use our school's Learning Management System, Canvas. This training is completely self-guided and students will work through it at their own pace. Students will watch instructional videos and work through a series of tasks or challenges to help them to be successful with the equipment this school year.
