Subject Area Grading Scale:

O = Outstanding, 90% and above

S = Successful, 70% - 89.99%

E = Emerging, Needs growth in this area, below 69.99%

First Grade students will be continually assessed using both formative and summative instruments such as rubrics, classroom activities, individual and group presentations, projects, quizzes, and tests. Activities that support learning such as group work, class work, and homework will comprise a smaller portion of the student's total grade.

Final grades will be determined by the following:

80% Authentic Assessment

- Formative and Summative assessments that may include tests, presentations, essays, and more.

20% Approaches to Learning

- Activities that support learning such as class work, participation, quizzes, homework, and collaborative projects.

Formative assessment

The goal of formative assessment is to monitor student learning and to provide ongoing feedback that can be used by teachers to improve their teaching, and by students to improve their learning.

More specifically, formative assessments:

- help students identify their strengths and weaknesses as well as target areas that need work.
- help faculty recognize where students are struggling and address problems immediately.

Summative assessment

The goal of summative assessment is to evaluate student learning at the end of an instructional unit by comparing it against standards and/or benchmarks.

Examples of summative assessments include:

- Tests
- Quizzes

Information from summative assessments can be used formatively when students or teachers use it to guide their efforts and activities in subsequent courses.

Our McGraw-Hill Reading and Language Arts series provides us with a variety of stories in five anthology books, five reading/writing workshop books and leveled mini-books. Children will acquire strategies for accessing information and for exploring concepts from many areas. During our reading group and center time, students will learn how to communicate effectively using both oral and written language and how to work both independently and collaboratively with the use of technology and their iPads.

Foundational Skills

Students should come prepared by recognizing letters and their sounds. Initially we use only the short vowel sounds for a, e, i, o, and u. From this point our curriculum includes the long vowel sounds, hearing beginning, medial and final letter sounds, vowel pairs, blends, digraphs and contractions. Students will be assessed on how well they apply phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words. Students will learn high frequency words and develop fluency and comprehension. Students will be assessed on how well they read text materials with appropriate fluency.

Reading Comprehension

Students will learn to determine word meaning using context clues as they read. They will read and comprehend a variety of grade level fictional and nonfictional texts. Text selection is always done with a Catholic lens of discernment and reflects our morals and values.

Language/Writing

Each trimester, students will be assessed on their language (listening and speaking), and writing skills. These skills include acquiring and using academic and subject specific vocabulary effectively. Students will follow instructions and participate in group discussions, using correct grammar, and speaking clearly and in complete sentences. Students will be taught academic and subject area vocabulary and use it effectively in communicating with others. Students will be taught to print correctly and legibly and use these skills in their daily work. Composition skills will focus on correct sentence structure, punctuation, capitalization, sequencing ideas as well as using a variety of writing styles. Students will be assessed on how well they produce clear and coherent writing on individual topics. Students will use technology as well as pencils for writing and collaborating on projects.

Our weekly spelling words will be incorporated from all aspects of the curriculum including phonics and reading. The students will be tested on these leveled words as well as dictation sentences each Friday. Students will be assessed on how well they spell words using appropriate skills.

Library:

Each class will visit the school library twice a month beginning this Fall.

Real-world applications will allow students to use math in their daily lives and give students the foundation for the math needed in the future. Applications in every lesson will inform students why it is important to learn mathematics. The goals for first grade math include mastering addition and subtraction facts to eighteen, two-digit addition and subtraction, place value, time, geometry, measurement and graphing. Daily Simple Solutions practice will strengthen problem solving strategies and accuracy in computation. Timed math tests will be used weekly to increase their speed and accuracy as they progress to addition and subtraction of numbers through eighteen.

History/Social Studies:

California standard units will be covered including geography, current events through Scholastic News, environmental concerns, and seasonal and national holidays of different cultures. Houghton Mifflin Social Studies Big Books are used to review and improve map skills and the use of reference materials. They will identify American symbols, leaders and community helpers. Students will demonstrate understanding the contents and concepts taught. They will apply content to activities and projects as they learn to be responsible citizens of the United States.

Science:

The hands-on elements in first grade utilize the instructional strategies and technology of the Discovery Education Techbook. It is a complete digital science resource designed to engage students in real-world, inquiry based science. It uses a variety of digital resources: video, audio, text, and interactive experiences to provide science content while meeting the needs of students with different learning styles.

The first grade curriculum features three major units of study:

- Physical science
- Life science
- Earth science

Students learn in accordance with the Next Generation Science Standards.

First grade students will also use the laboratory kits provided by our Beckman @Science grant. Students will demonstrate understanding of content and concepts taught. They will apply science curricular content to experiments and STEAM projects. Students will enjoy an interactive field study at Trabuco Canyon Elementary School.

Seesaw

An on-line student portfolio used by students to show accomplishments towards curriculum standards and Student Learning Expectations.

Freckle

An adaptive on-line program in which students work on mastery of standards in all subject areas.

Specialty Classes

In addition to the subjects listed above, first grade students are provided with art, music, creativity lab, and physical education classes, each with a specific teacher who specializes in the subject area.

Music: Mrs. Teri Schulist

First grade music continues to build on the music basics students learned in kindergarten. Students learn patriotic music, songs of the seasons, and participate in other school activities. Students will participate in games, hands-on instrument activities, and much more music fun! Students will be assessed by how well they understand and apply music concepts, and participate during instruction.

Art: Ms. Rao

All first grade students are required to have an Art Sketchbook (8.5 x 11 spiral bound) which is available for purchase at various stores. The St. Junipero Serra Catholic Art Program offers students the opportunity to understand, interpret, and appreciate the visual arts by exploring their creative potential through hands-on art projects. Emphasis is on creative exploration and manipulation of various art mediums. Students will expand their knowledge by

developing and building upon their art vocabulary while learning and applying the art elements successfully; to create their own masterpieces. Students will discover that the creative process is a life-long way to express their personal world, ideas, and emotions. Technology is integrated into the art curriculum to view and critique famous masterpieces.

Creativity Lab: Mrs. Kim Biasca

In the Creativity Lab students will discover a “playground for learning.” The Creativity Lab is a 21st century learning lab for students of all interests, ages, and abilities. Creativity Labs put technology and learning resources in the hands of students, engaging learners in science, technology, reading, engineering, the arts, and mathematics (STREAM) while building critical 21st century skills. Young learners will engage in hands-on projects and experiences ranging from computer graphics & digital media arts to circuitry & robotics. Students will be learning and exploring with Zometools, Botley the Coding Robot, Knex, Ozobots, Snap Circuits, Osmo, Makey Makey and so much more.

Physical Education: Mr. John Rodriguez

Program Goals:

The St. Junipero Serra Catholic School Physical Education Program focuses on two main areas of student development and learning.

1. As part of the School Wide Learning Expectations at St. Junipero Serra Catholic School the students participate in a physical education program that creates “a reverence for one’s own physical being” and “a positive and realistic self-image”.
2. The students will develop the values of sportsmanship and fair play, and be able to transfer those learned skills into their everyday life.

Description:

Students will have PE class twice a week for a total of eight classes per month. Sports will be introduced and played at all levels of skill including, football, basketball, soccer, and various other games as well as working on the student’s fine and gross motor skills Health and Nutrition will be discussed and included.

Uniform Policy:

1. The PE Uniform can be worn all day if the student has PE class on that particular day (Formal Dress Day Policy Below).
2. Shorts must be worn to waist level (especially the boys) and the shorts may not be rolled up at the waist or worn too high (especially the girls), all uniform policies and decisions are made at the discretion and judgment of the Physical Education Department and Principal. During the winter months students may wear the designated school sweats or solid-color white, navy, or black leggings under their PE shorts.
3. Closed toe *athletic* shoes that are fit for running, secured on the foot, are required for all PE classes.
4. The school policy, in regard to PE uniform requirements on Formal Dress Uniform Days is that the students are to wear their Formal Uniform with athletic shoes until after the designated event for the day.
5. Socks may be plain white, navy or black and can only have a small, single color logo on them.

Grading Policy:

The majority of the grade in PE is not determined by the God given talents that each individual student has, but rather upon many factors within the student's control. The five behavioral factors that, if followed, can produce a grade of high merit are:

1. *Student positive attitude and respect for others.*
2. *Promptness and being on time to class.*
3. *Following uniform guidelines.*
4. *Participation.*
5. *Effort shown in the assigned task.*

The daily grade given to each student will be based upon these factors and deductions will be made for those students who do not meet these requirements. The overall grade is determined upon 18-20 grades each trimester that are weighted equally that will encompass and be based on the following marks:

***Rubrics Standards Based Grading:

- 4 = Consistently meets standards/expectations
- 3 = Frequently meets standards/expectations
- 2 = Occasionally meets standards/expectations
- 1 = Rarely meets standards/expectations

Injuries and Sickness:

- As a part of any physical program in school or outside of school, injuries or illnesses that do occur need to be reported to the teacher.
- During class students must notify the teacher immediately of any injury that occurs during class, even if they are still able to participate.
- Any condition that requires the student to miss two consecutive days or more of PE will require a medical note from the doctor. The note should specify the injury and specific limitations as well as the specific date your child may resume regular activity in PE class.
- All notes for injuries or other information must be delivered, or sent via e-mail to the PE teacher, by 7:30 a.m. on the day of the PE class.
- If there is a discipline problem, the student will be given a verbal warning; if the problem persists it will be communicated by the PE teacher via e-mail, phone call or a note in FACTS to the parent.

Class Rules:

Students will follow the St. Junipero Serra Catholic School Code of Conduct, Section 8000 of the Parent Handbook at all times while in physical education class.

- Students will be on time and ready on your number when the teacher is ready to take roll
- Students will be quiet and respectful during prayer in class.
- Students will not talk while the teacher is talking, or any other teacher or adult visitor
- Students will show proper sportsmanship and respect for all members of the class

First Grade Information

Classroom Conduct:

We encourage the children to put forth their best effort in everything they do. Since lifelong success depends in part on self-discipline, we have developed a discipline program which provides the students with guidance in making good choices. We believe that your child deserves the most positive Catholic educational climate possible for his/her growth in fulfilling the Student Learning Expectations.

Responsible Behavior Goals

1. Models Christ-like behavior
2. Understands Jesus
3. Displays cooperative attitude and participates appropriately
4. Engages collaboratively and effectively in interpersonal group, or teacher led discussions

4. Follows classroom, school, and playground rules and procedures
5. Listens to and demonstrates respect for authority figures
6. Shows acceptance of others
7. Accepts personal responsibility and correction
8. With direction, controls emotions and self-corrects behavior

Personal Success Skills Goals

1. Communicates effectively using appropriate vocabulary, volume, and patterns
2. Demonstrating basic reasoning skills when solving problems
3. Articulates steps taken to reach solutions
4. With direction, perseveres to completion of tasks, finding solutions to problems
5. Carefully completes tasks while following directions and demonstrating neatness and accuracy
6. Maintains needed supplies and uses them appropriately
7. With guidance, stays on task and uses time effectively
8. Demonstrates basic understanding of technology and uses it effectively

Our classroom rules are:

1. I will keep my hands, my feet, and all objects to myself.
2. I will raise my hand before I speak or stand.
3. I will keep the classroom neat and clean,
4. I will be kind to my classmates.
5. I will listen and follow directions.

Parents will be notified via a phone call if behavior becomes a problem.

Illness

If your child has had a fever or the stomach flu, they must not come to school until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The classroom teacher must be informed along with the Health

Room of strep throat, pink eye, lice or any other contagious disease as soon as possible. Please review the Health Room policy carefully. Please refer to the Family Health Commitment form you signed previously for information in relation to COVID-19.

Absences Due to Medical/Dental Appointments

While we recognize the importance of routine medical check-ups, along with the difficulty of available after school appointment times, absences will affect your child's academic performance. It is important that you post your child's schedule in your home and refer to it when you make these appointments.

Homework Policy and Assessment Make-Ups

Homework has a definite place in the educational process. It is an extension of the learning experience children have during the day. Homework is designed to aid the student in classroom and school goals. It also prepares them for upcoming lessons, teaches responsibility and helps develop positive study habits. Please encourage neat and complete homework. In first grade, daily reading is essential for optimum growth. Either the student reads from an outside reading source or is read to by an experienced reader.

Addition and subtraction facts should be practiced daily at home on the iPad or by using flashcards. Timed tests will be sent home to practice for weekly time tests in class.

1. Make sure homework has the proper heading (first and last names written inside the lines).
2. Please correct letter formation, size of letters, and spacing.
3. **Practice reading High Frequency/Sight words, Spelling words and Math facts daily. These words will be assessed regularly.**
4. Make sure iPad homework is completed and submitted each week.
5. Please encourage students to punctuate and phonetically sound out words when they create their own sentences.
6. Please make sure iPads return to school daily and are fully charged.
7. Homework will be sent home on Monday in a weekly packet and is due back on Friday. The homework cover page will be viewable online. The link to the homework cover sheet will also be available in Canvas. Assignments will be attached to the weekly packet and will not be assigned online unless we go to distance learning online.

It is important that you work with your child, encouraging them and checking their work. When the homework is not turned in on time, the assignment will be expected on the following day. Turning homework in on time promotes responsibility and good study skills. Please encourage neat and complete homework. When your child is absent, assignments can be obtained the day your child returns to school and returned to the teacher. **Homework is not given in advance. Please see Section #510 in the Parent-Student Handbook.**

Daily Folder

All corrected classwork and tests will be sent home weekly in a folder. Please review the work with your child, and return the following school day. **Keep all papers/work at home.** You do not need to return your child's work the next day, only the folder. This information will assist parents in monitoring their child's progress.

Homework Club

This fee-based program has been developed for students who are struggling to complete homework. Homework Club will provide a small group environment (maximum class size of ten students), enabling students to focus and work on their homework. Students will receive attention and motivation in a warm and encouraging atmosphere. If you believe your child would benefit from attending Homework Club, please contact Mrs. Ellen Burrola, Assistant Principal, Preschool-Grade 4, at eburrola@serraschool.org. The pick-up after homework club is at 3:05pm,. If your child is not picked up by 3:05 pm they will be signed into Extended Care by the homework club teacher. A fee for Extended Care will apply.

Arrival/Dismissal

When your child arrives at school, he/she will go straight to the classroom. After 7:55 a.m., students must go to the School Office to receive a late slip.

Parents are encouraged to carpool and use the traffic pattern. Please do not park in the MemorialCare parking lot or the neighborhood off of Galisteo Street across from the Primary Education Building. Students are expected to walk independently to their class lunch table or classroom. Staff is available and will escort younger students to the lunch tables or classrooms.

TK-2 Dismissal

All TK – 2nd grade students are dismissed at 2:00 p.m, Monday through Friday, with the exception of the minimum day Wednesdays when the students will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m. **Students are to be picked up promptly. If your child's first or second grade sibling or carpool is participating in an after school program such as Mad Science, Homework Club, Chess, etc., the First or Second Grade student still needs to be picked up at 2:00 PM. They do not qualify for the Later Gator program.**

Lator Gator Program

If first or second grade students are in a carpool with students who are in Grades Three through Eight, they will be supervised until the second dismissal. This program is called Lator Gators. If your younger child is in the Lator Gator Program, please direct the oldest sibling or carpool child to pick up the first grade student from the Lator Gator table in the PEB lunch area when their name is called and walk them to the stairway area. **If your child's older sibling or older carpool member is absent, chooses to play a sport, or participate in an afterschool activity such as Homework Club, dance, music, etc. the first grade student must be picked up at the 2:00 pm dismissal.**

2:40 PM Dismissal, Change in Schedule, and Extended Care

“Lator Gator” children not picked by 3:05 p.m.will be enrolled in the Extended Care Program and the family will be charged for the time spent in the Extended Care Program.

If your child has a change in schedule, please inform the classroom teacher in writing or by email as soon as possible. We want to make sure that we know where your child needs to be for his/her safety. The Extended Care hours are from 6:30 to 7:15 a.m. and 2:00 to 6:00 p.m.

Peanut Free School

Please do not send any food items containing peanuts. If any snacks or lunches contain peanuts, we will be sending it back home with a reminder for you. If the child needs lunch to replace the peanut item, a lunch will be provided and the family will be charged.

Snack Time

We will be having a morning snack break. On Monday through Friday, please have your child bring a small individual healthy snack to be eaten at recess. The children need a mid-morning boost. **Please do not send in glass containers. Please send your child's snack in a labeled bag/baggie.**

Lunch

Lunch boxes or brown bags must be labeled. Emergency Contacts

If your child is going home with someone other than usual, please write a note indicating that your child has your permission to go home with that specific adult. We cannot release the child to another adult that is not on your emergency form on file in the school office. Due to traffic, please do not arrive for the afternoon carpool until 2:25 p.m. **Please – no cell phone use during dismissal traffic times.**

Conferences

We are available to conference with parents concerning their child. Parents are welcome to contact the teacher by sending an email, leaving a voice message, or writing a note to request an appointment. Our priority is your child's safety. We cannot allow "drop by" conferences, nor can we talk with you during supervision of dismissal traffic, recess, or first thing in the morning. Please do not call during class hours. We will respond to phone or email messages within 24 hours, excluding weekends. This year formal parent-teacher conferences will be held in October.

Dress Code

Please review the St. Junipero Serra Catholic School Dress Code policy carefully which can be found in the Parent Handbook on the school website. If your child has not met the requirements for the uniform dress code, a reminder will be sent home. All sweatshirts need to be clearly labeled. P.E. uniforms are only to be worn on P.E. days. You will be informed of days when formal uniform is required in the Room Parent Sunday email reminder and in the weekly electronic newsletter. Teachers are not responsible for lost items such as sweatshirts, lunch boxes, and backpacks. Lost and found items are placed on a rack in the hallway near the Extended Care room in the MEC building, Room C1-103.

Personal Belongings

Due to space limitations, trading cards, small toys, excessive jewelry, and non-school related accessories should not be brought to school. Students may never use cell phones during the

school day. If a child needs to call a parent after school, he/she must ask the teacher or supervisor for permission and the teacher must supervise the call.

Important Note about Parent Volunteers

All volunteers must be eligible for supervision of students by completing the fingerprinting requirements of the Diocese of Orange and must have successfully completed the Safe Environment training. Please contact Mrs. Diana McCarron at x102 if you need to determine your eligibility.

Birthdays

Students may wear non-uniform dress to school on their birthday unless it's a formal uniform day. If that occurs, we'll choose an alternate day for non-uniform dress. At this time, students may not bring in treats or trinkets to share with classmates at recess.

You may also choose to purchase a book for our school library in honor of your child's birthday. Summer birthdays will be celebrated on a child's half-birthday. If a birthday falls on a weekend or holiday, a child's special day may be arranged with the teacher.

If every child in the classroom is invited to a party, invitations can be passed out in the classroom. If your guest list is limited, please handle invitations by mail only!
